

# Baltic Sea activities 1

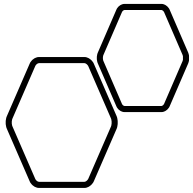
- Animals' in youtube for the Baltic Sea
